Improving financial access to health care in Congo

Reflection Paper n° 003 - January 2015 | BTC's knowledge building series

Reforms in Kisantu health district in RD Congo have shown that it is possible to shift from a fee-for-service payment to a subsidized flat rate payment system. Such a financing system guarantees better access to health care for the poor population and increases equity in the health financing system.

Health workers will change their behaviour if they earn a correct salary for quality work. The people will change their behaviour and use public health services if these services are functional and if they are provided at a fair, affordable and predictable cost.
