I just watched this video of Chirari Mahato's wife, son and best friend recounting his last days.

After working a 12-hour shift in temperatures reaching 40 degrees,
Chirari Mahato died in his sleep in a blistering hot room in a Qatari labour camp.

Because Chirari died in his sleep and not during working hours, **his family were refused compensation**. His room was crammed with people and did not have proper ventilation.

It makes me angry that Chirari's family do not have a union to stand up to his employer in Qatar.

This week I'm in Doha talking to **migrant workers who do not have the right to form or join a union**. Hundreds of governments and thousands of people are also in Qatar for a UN meeting on climate.

They will be looked after by migrant workers who work for companies operating outside of international law, in a country

which does not respect UN standards on labour rights.
