= THE WEB OF REPRESSION

What does a French-Algerian footballer in Doha have to do with a Pakistani teacher in Islamabad? And what do tear-gassed labour activists in Istanbul have in common with assaulted workers in Suva, Fiji? This edition of the Equal Times newsletter comes out just a few days after International Workers Day. Even though it comes 127 years after **workers in Chicago died** to ensure the eight-hour work day, we are still a long way off from celebrating universal labour and human rights. In Turkey, those marching on May Day and protesting against new anti-union measures were attacked by the police, leaving over 200 injured.

This happened while a French-Algerian footballer threatened to go on hunger strike to reclaim his documents and escape from Qatar with his family; meanwhile, a young Pakistani teacher struggles to ensure girls' education for even the poorest members of her community; and elsewhere, workers try to organise and oppose the regime in Fiji.

What's at stake, in all these stories, are the fundamental rights to organise, to freedom of movement, to an education. What's at stake, simply, is democracy.
