This week the FIFA Congress is meeting on the island paradise of Mauritius.

We're here to make sure FIFA knows that unless Qatar reforms its treatment of workers, the 2022 World Cup vote must be re-run.

Defender Abdes Ouaddou **played 57 times for Morocco**, as well as AS Nancy-Lorraine and Fulham but was **treated like a slave in Qatar**.
