Three and half years ago Qatar were controversially awarded the right to host the 2022 World Cup.

Since December 2010, approximately **1000 migrant workers have died**.

Today an email arrived from the wife of Krishna Bahadur, a Nepali who died in Qatar.

His widow and mother of two children told us how she received a phone call on her 16th wedding anniversary to tell her husband was dead.

“It is not one person killed in Qatar. It is the entire family who have been destroyed with the passing of my husband,” Kamala said.

We’ve been talking to FIFA and Qatar, but their record is full of broken promises.

A few weeks ago we witnessed first-hand the heavy tactics of FIFA when a group of peaceful protesters were [arrested outside the FIFA Congress in Mauritius](#).

There is still time to save lives.
