On May 2nd, the ETUC met with the College of Commissioners to discuss the roadmap for the social dimension of the Economic and Monetary Union under preparation. Workers' rights to free movement

Positive signal from the Commission

In October 1968, the EU Member States agreed to mutually open up their labour markets to all EU citizens. This freedom was complemented by the right to equal treatment, an essential corollary to the right to free movement. On April 26th, the European Commission launched a proposal for a new enforcement directive on measures facilitating the exercise of the rights conferred on workers in the context of the freedom of movement of workers. The ETUC welcomed this proposal that aims to make it easier for people to exercise their rights in practice, to overcome any obstacles and to help prevent discrimination against workers on the basis of nationality.
