European elections
For citizens the crisis is not over



Commenting on the European elections, Bernadette Ségol said: *"The voters have sent a warning to all mainstream and governing parties. European citizens are fed up with unemployment, austerity and falling living standards. For citizens the crisis is not over. Saving the Euro was a start. But the real challenge is to get Europe's 26 million unemployed back to work. Continued austerity is not the answer. Europe needs major investment at EU and national level to drive sustainable growth and job creation. The European Parliament must insist on deciding who becomes President of the European Commission".*

Spring forecast

EU economy far from healthy

The European Commission recently released his spring 2014 economic forecast by announcing that Europe is experiencing signs of recovery. According to Veronica Nilsson, ETUC Confederal Secretary *"the European economy is far from healthy. Recent forecasts show no significant fall in unemployment. With 26 million unemployed, and unemployment rates forecast to go from 10.5% this year to 10.1% next – it is hard to see in what sense there is real recovery. The levels of unemployment, poverty and inequality in the European Union today are a disgrace and should be worrying the European Commission far more than they seem to."*
