Trade unions' activities

ITUC/GURN: A green economy that works for social progress

The Global Union Research Network (GURN) platform held its annual workshop on 24-25 October 2011 in Berlin. The focus was on the working conditions in green jobs in diverse sectors. Participants presented case studies of working conditions in China, Peru, South Africa and Spain. Other topics were environmental rights and collective bargaining, environmental issues, whereby initiatives involving social partners in Europe on climate and employment as well as taxation were presented. The ETUC Executive Committee (19-20 October 2011) adopted three resolutions concerning Rio+20, Durban COP17 and Energy Efficiency:

- **ETUC Resolution on Rio+20: Strengthening the social dimension of sustainable development**
The resolution demands the inclusion of Just Transition and Decent Work in any concluding text or agreement, the creation of a universal social protection floor to ensure this Just Transition. It also calls for the adoption of a global target of at least 50% increase in 'green and decent' jobs by 2015. [Read more](#)
- **ETUC resolution on EU position at Durban COP17**
Considering the very slow pace of international negotiations and attempts by certain governments to use a 'voluntary pledge' system, the ETUC finds important to avoid a regulatory gap in international emission

commitments and urges to preserve the legally binding and top-down aspects that a 2nd commitment p bring. [Read more](#)

- ETUC resolution on Comments on the proposal for a Directive on Energy Efficiency CO 370 final of 22 June 2011

The resolution contains the ETUC's priorities for the European Union's energy policy for 2020. ETUC es worker engagement and participation in energy efficiency programmes are crucial for their success. To e implementation, worker involvement through social dialogue in the formulation of policy and the devel skills and education programmes is of paramount importance, as well as measures ensuring good worki and health and security at work.
