4th High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness & the Busan Civil Society Forum

Only one week is left to the **4th High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness (HLF4)**. Over 2000 representatives of donor and partner governments, as well as delegates from international institutions, civil society organisations and media from all around the world will meet in Busan, South Korea to discuss how to make aid and development more effective.

Just before the HLF4, civil society organisations united in the BetterAid platform will host the **Busan Civil Society Forum (BCSF)** to prepare together for an effective participation at the High Level Forum.

On top of a delegation of almost 40 trade union representatives from 25 different countries, ITUC contributes to both events with the trade union perspective captured in the key documents ([see below](#)) and by hosting some of the sessions ([see below](#)).
