Rio+20 Lobby Week Update: First one a success, but more to be done

From 27 February to 9 March, national centres and ITUC representatives met with government negotiators, civil society representatives and UN agencies in New York and in national capitals with the objective to bring trade union messages to the Rio+20 negotiating text. This week in New York, delegations are discussing the text, and a new version will be prepared soon after. The impact of our collective lobby effort is clear: we have strengthened the references to decent work, including employment aspects of environmental policies, social protection and workers' rights among other labour demands. But you all know, nothing is won until it is won...

Some governments expressed their reluctance to support social equity, others insist on promoting safety nets, rather than social protection...This means we need even more support in the weeks to come in order to get our demands confirmed: a commitment to decent employment creation through environmentally-respectful investments, a commitment to fully implement social protection floors as a first step towards ensuring the right to social security for all and the launch of a financial transaction tax. Trade Union Assembly on Labour and Environment II: Start participating today

Trade unions will go to Rio to demand that leaders embark on a different path, towards a genuinely sustainable economic model. While there, trade unions will also work on our own agenda of commitments and proposals on building sustainability at the Trade Union Assembly on Labour and Environment (June

10, 11 and 12) in Rio. The Assembly will include a plenary on a new development paradigm: challenges for employment, social inclusion and poverty eradication in a sustainable planet; financing sustainable development; the right to information, participation and justice; and the social protection floor, among others.

Working Groups are being prepared now on sustainable access to food, energy and water; green jobs and just transition: opportunities and challenges for women and youth, trade union action and climate change; sustainable management of chemical substances, and collective bargaining for sustainable development. Do you think a topic is missing? Then let us know.

We are asking you to attend, AND we are calling on you to contribute to the planning the Assembly.
