INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

SOLIDAR SENDS LETTER TO EU COUNCIL AND FOREIGN AFFAIRS MINISTERS ON GAZA

In the aftermath of Israel's military operation in Gaza leading to a flurry of diplomacy on both sides of the Atlantic, SOLIDAR and its members have written a letter, based on the common SOLIDAR position agreed on in the last ICC, to the European Council whose Foreign Affairs Ministers will meet on Monday 26 January to call for the EU to take decisive measures to ensure a just and lasting peace to the situation in the Occupied Palestinian Territories. Underlining the importance of respect for international law, SOLIDAR has called on EU member states to use their so-called "soft power" to hold Israel accountable for its actions and to politically engage itself in the peace process.

Specifically, SOLIDAR has asked for the EU to exert political pressure to ensure that:

1. The Israeli government grants immediate access to humanitarian aid and materials necessary for reconstruction by opening the border crossings and ending the blockade of Gaza;
2. The Egyptian government commits to the same vis-à-vis the opening of the Rafah crossing;
3. All parties agree to an end to all violence;
4. A full investigation into accusations of possible war crimes committed.

SITUATION IN SRI LANKA

The international media have given extended coverage to the assassination of the editor of the Sri Lankan 'Sunday Leader' and his editorial predicting the complicity of the Sri Lankan government in his death. There has been little publicity about continuing assassinations in the East of the country (24 deaths recorded by UNHCR in November) and the general climate of fear in the resettled areas.

In the North, where journalists are not allowed and the UN and INGOs were expelled by the government, more than a quarter of a million Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) are concentrated into restricted areas by the army advances. Basic food and non food supplies are short and the numbers of civilian deaths from shelling and aerial attacks are increasing. This has left a grave humanitarian crisis and a potential human rights disaster. [Read more...](#)

MINISTERS OF LABOUR & SOCIAL AFFAIRS TROIKA MEET WITH SOCIAL PLATFORM

On Thursday, a Social Platform (SP) delegation, led by Conny Reuter in his capacity as President of the SP, met the Ministers of Labour and Social Affairs Troika composed of Petr Nečas (Czech Republic), Christina Husmark-Pehrsson (Sweden) and Celestino Corbacho Chaves (Spain), as well as the European Commissioner Vladimír Špidla.

The Czech Presidency has put the mobility of workers as a priority because "mobility also boosts economic growth and the EU competitiveness in the global economic competition. It increases employment, reduces labour costs and social exclusion and poverty" (Presidency paper for the informal EPSCO council). [Read more...](#)
