EUROPEAN PROGRESSIVES CALL FOR THE G-20 TO SUPPORT FINANCIAL TRANSACTION TAXES

The [Europeans For Financial Reform](#) (EFFR) coalition, of which SOLIDAR is an active member, urges G-20 leaders to make concrete progress towards the introduction of an internationally coordinated financial transactions tax (FTT) at the G20 summit taking place today in Seoul.

This proposal for an FTT is not just wishful thinking, but a feasible initiative backed by experts. The recent International Monetary Fund (IMF) [paper](#) has pointed out that most G-20 countries have already implemented some form of transaction tax, so the only thing that is really needed now is the political will to harmonise them. The paper also confirmed that an FTT can generate substantial revenues, which are especially necessary for investment in social infrastructure. Read the [full media release](#).
