ISIS Abducting, Killing, Expelling Iraq's Minorities

The Islamic State of Iraq and Sham (ISIS) is killing, kidnapping, and threatening religious and ethnic minorities in and around the northern Iraqi city of Mosul. Since capturing Mosul on June 10, 2014, the armed Sunni extremist group has seized at least 200 Turkmen, Shabaks, and Yazidis, killed at least 11 of them, and ordered all Christians to convert to Islam, pay "tribute" money, or leave Mosul.




[Central African Republic: No Amnesty for Serious Crimes](#)




[Airstrike Deaths in Gaza Raise Concerns on Ground Offensive](#)


