Imagine a child working on a tobacco farm, absorbing nicotine and pesticides into her skin. She experiences nausea, headaches, dizziness, vomiting – all symptoms of nicotine poisoning.

In the United States, **children as young as 12 are hired to work on tobacco farms**, risking acute nicotine poisoning, serious injury, and other dangers to their health.
